# 1.3 HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF THE ORGANIZATION (ROYAL FM 95.1 ILORIN KWARA STATE)

Royal FM (95.1 MHz) is a radio station in Ilorin Kwara State, Nigeria. It was founded in 2011 by Gbenga Adebayo, a telecommunications engineer, and broadcast online before receiving final approval for FM operation later that year. The first private FM Radio Station in Ilorin, North Central Nigeria. Royal FM is a radio station located in Ilorin, Kwara State. This is a classic music radio

station that plays the best entertainment classic music as well as information. It was launched in 2010.

Radio Broadcasting was introduced into Nigeria in 1933 by the then Colonial Government. It relayed the overseas service of the British Broadcasting Corporation through a wired system with loudspeakers at the listening end. The service was called the Radio Diffusion System, RDS.

From the Radio Diffusion System, emerged the Nigeria Broadcasting Service, (NBS) in April 1951. Mr. T.W. Chalmers, a Briton, and Controller of the BBC Light Entertainment Programme was the first Director-General of the Nigeria Broadcasting Service (NBS).

Thereafter, the Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation (NBC), came into being in April 1957 through an Act of Parliament No. 39 of 1956. The Director-General was Mr. J.A.C Knott OBE. In 1978, the Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation was re-organized to become the Federal Radio Corporation of Nigeria, FRCN.

The Nigerian Broadcasting Corporation (NBC) handed over her stations that broadcast on Medium Wave frequencies in the States to the State Governments while it took over Short Wave Transmitters from the States. Consequently, Broadcasting Corporation of Northern Nigeria, (BCNN) was merged with NBC stations in Lagos, Ibadan and Enugu to form the present-day FRCN. Reverend Victor Badejo was the first indigenous Director-General of Radio Nigeria.

Engr. Gbenga Adebayo is the President and Founder of Royal FM 95.1Mhz. The first private FM Radio Station in Ilorin, North Central Nigeria. He is the Chairman of African Broadband Limited. He is the Chairman and Group Chief Executive Officer of Communication Network Support Services Limited and CNSSL Contact Centre Limited a Leading Business Process Outsource Company in Telecom Network Engineering and Contact Centre Operations across Nigeria. He is the Chairman and Founder of Savannah Hotels and Resort Centre, Ilorin Nigeria and he is the Owner and Chief Farmer of Chesterfield Farms Limited.

Adebayo is the current Chairman of the Association of Licensed Telecom Operators of Nigeria (ALTON), an industry association for all Telecommunications Operators in Nigeria.

Gbenga, is the Chancellor of Premier Vocational Training Institute Nigeria. A foremost vocational training centre for middle Level Manpower development across trades in Nigeria. A founding Partner of A Comet Premier Services (UK) limited, a Consultancy and Advisory Services Company registered in England and Wales.

He is the Proprietor of Heilung Kreuz Hospital, a foremost private medical practice in Lagos, South West Nigeria.

The Author of Telecom in Nigeria, a role in the call, a book on telecommunications development in Nigeria (2006). A former General Manager of VGC Communications Ltd. Nigeria, a Private Telephone Operator and provider of digital fibre optic supported land line services, data communications and broadband internet services.

A member of Nigeria National Broadband Policy Implementation Committee from 2012-2018. He served for eight years as a member of the Governing Board of Digital Bridge Institute Abuja – Nigeria. A member of Nigeria National Communications Policy Review Committee An advisory council member of the International Biographical Centre, Cambridge, United Kingdom.

Today, the FRCN, as a public service broadcaster with its headquarters in Abuja, has Six (6) Zonal Stations in Enugu, Ibadan, Kaduna, Lafia, Maiduguri and Port Harcourt as well as Abuja and Lagos Operation Offices. The Zonal Stations and Operation Offices supervise all the 37 FRCN FM/MW/SW stations spread across the country reaching more than 100 million Audiences; broadcasting in 15 languages, catering to the diverse broadcast needs of a multi-ethnic Nigerian; uplifting the people and uniting the nation.

The Corporation also has its stations streaming live audio on the Internet at: www. radionigeria.gov.ng, thus reaching millions audiences around the world.

At the Headquarters, there is a Committee of Management (COM) is headed by the most senior Director as Chairman, with other Directors and Heads of Departments as members. There is also a Committee of Management (COM) at each of the Zonal Stations headed by a Zonal Director/Director assisted by Heads of sub-Directorates, General Managers of FM Stations.

# 3.1 EXPERIENCE GAINED IN ROYAL FM 95.1 ILORIN KWARA STATE

My Experience at royal FM 95.1 Ilorin kwara is a great one and am opportuned to put all what I experience into action even though there is not much time.

I am attached to the programs department. The programming department is responsible for filling the entire broadcast day with programming and is therefore saddled with arguably the most challenging job in television.

I have experience in the program department on how different kinds of program are presented live in the studio room. The live program is being controlled from the Master control room (MCR) By a certain specialist and trained personnel who is saddled with the responsibility of Controlling all the studio activities on system and calling action of when the live program ought to start and end.

One of the important experience I ever had is production of music content for a different programmes which I have the opportunity to refined and edit musical content through precise editing and censorship for a series of station programmes.

One of the live programs I usually witness is a series of live programmes whereby different programs come up such as interviews on a certain issue by guest speaker and host, Call in by listeners, News review and other interesting topics. News is another live program broadcasted to the audience Morning, afternoon and night, I have the experience of watching the News presenter

reading the content of news to the viewers while a technical personnel controlling the pictures, images, videos or sounds from the master control room. The personnel are known as master control room operators.

I also have the experience of witnessing major equipment in the news room and how it is used such as Teleprompter, Microphones, Headphones, Cameras, Tripod etc. I usually watch how cameras are used by the technical personnel during live program and with the experience it will be easier for me to handle cameras anytime I really want to for practical communication.

Lastly, I am here to gain experience at the social media department where I have the opportunity to stream different live programmes on different social media handles. This in turn make user of different and modern technology techniques and applications for stream online programmes.

# 4.2 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The students industrial work experience scheme (SIWES) is a training fund (ITF) in 1973 to bridge the gap between theory and practical oriented among

students of engineering, technology, social science and medical science on Nigeria higher institution of learning.

It provides for the job practical experience for students as they are expose to work method and machinery that may not be Available in their institution. At inception in 1974, the scheme started with 748 from 11 institution and 104 eligible course by 2008. 210 student participate in the course from 219 institution over the 112 eligible course. However the rapid growth and exposition of SIWES has occurred against the backdrop of successive economic crisis which have affected the smooth operation and administration of the scheme. Most industries are operating below in storage capacity while other are completely shutdown in Nigeria. This has impacted negatively on the scheme as higher institution of learning find it increasingly difficult to secure placement.
