#### **CHAPTER ONE**

#### INTRODUCTION

#### 1.1 **DEFINITION OF SIWES**

The Student Industrial Work Experience Scheme (SIWES) of the Nigeria Polytechnic and colleges of technologies is an arrangement in which practical is integrated with theory.

It is also established by the Industrial Training Fund (ITF) in 1974 to bridge the gap between theory and practical. The programme has a nice focus on the development of industrial students in the world of work. Also how theory and practical are social skills -and insight in the world of work to create awareness and prospect are the challenges the programme tries to tackle to cope with the development process of the student.

# 1.3 HISTORICAL BACKGROUND OF THE ORGANIZATION (KWARA TV)

Kwara State Television was established in 1997 by Alhaji Shaaba Lafiaji the then Executive Governor of the state. The Television Station was promulgated into law in 1999 with six departments which are Administration, News and Current Affairs, Programs, Engineering, Accounts and Marketing.

Mallam Ishaq Moddibo Kawu was the pioneer General Manager of the television station. One of the former governors of the state, Alhaji Mohammed Lawal merged both the state broadcasting corporation and television station

which was referred to as Kwara State Broadcasting Corporation, after the tenure of Malla Moddibo Kawu, Governor Lawal appointed Alhaja Meiro Mustapha as the Director General to run the affairs of both agencies.

Alhaja Mustapha was succeeded in year 2003 by Alhaji Salami Ayilara who was appointed chairman, a position he held for three months, following which Mallam Lasisi Bello former Director Programs of the station took over as the General Manager in the same year.

Mallam Lasis Bello who took over the mantle of leadership was there till the year 2005 when Mallam Tajudeen AbdulKareem was appointed the next General Manager. Mallam Tajudeen was however removed by Doctor Bukola Saraki who became the state governor at the time.

Engineer Kolawole Tomori the Director Engineering of corporation was announced the Acting General Manager after the exits of Mallam Tajudeen AbdulKareem. Engineer Tomori's tenure terminated two years later with the appointment of another Acting General Manager in person of Mallam Nurudeen Imam Abdulrahim with effect from 3<sup>rd</sup> June, 2009 and later became the substantive general manager of the station on 27<sup>th</sup> February, 2009.

On the 16<sup>th</sup> of June, 2010, Barrister Mahmood Abdulraheem replaced Mallam Imam as the general manager for a period of nine months before he was replaced temporarily by the state commissioner of information Mr. Tunji Moronfoye Who also doubles as the administrator of the corporation. Mr Moronfoye held sway until Alhaji Adewale Adebowale Adedeji the General Manager of the state radio station was made General Manager of both the radio and the television stations.

In November 2012, Alhaji Abdulfatai Adewale Adebowale was appointed the general manager by his Excellency, Governor Abdulfatah Ahmed and on the March 5<sup>th</sup> 2019, Mallam Olarenwaju Sambo Qudus was appointed as acting General Manager of the corporation. In couple of years, after some performance in the office, another General Manager was appointed in person of Mr. Michael Olatunde on 2021.

As the progress of the station keep improving, Mr. Ayobami Akanbi was handing over power, to be the General Manager of the station, in which the mantle of his leadership, which keep the major establishment of the station objectivity. Mr Michael Olatunde emerge as the general manager till date.

As at 2022, Kwara state television authority development represents another first in the history of the broadcast station which was established over two decades ago through the present governor of Kwara state Abdulrahman Abdulrasak. The switch, which makes Kwara Tv available on StarTimes Channel 113 and Free TV Channel 502, is one of the early steps towards making it available on DSTV. Drab and barely available even locally, Kwara Tv

went off air last September for reforms and relaunch after years of poor showings and skeletal services. The Kwara Tv had its golden years in the 1990s when it was the darling of the Kwara people and neighbouring states. Kwara TV General Manager Olatunde Michael said the launch was the first of the three phases of bringing Kwara Tv back to public reckoning, adding that they now plan to go national in the second phase and then international via the DSTV in the third.

#### 3.1 EXPERIENCE GAINED IN KWARA TV

My Experience at Kwara state television authority (KWARA TV) is a great one and am opportuned to put all what I experience into action even though there is not much time. I am attached to the Programmes Production department. The Programmes department is responsible for filling the entire broadcast day with News and is therefore saddled with arguably the most challenging job in television. One of my major experiences in the news department is that I am able to witness how reporters gathered news from several events and social issues in which it will be broadcast by the news presenter at a certain time for the audience. I observed and gained experience about writing news, the more you write the more the level of writing improves, that is continuous exercise in writing news, stories, articles, features etc. enhance better knowledge.

With this kind of observation, I am able to have the experience of sourcing news on different sites both online and physical newspapers.

I am able to have the experience on how news is written in a Line up order and not only to write news make a newsworthy but editing of news is major work to make a newsworthy. I have the experience of editing news with the aid of editing tools such as laptop, software applications and so on.

I have experience in the News department on how different kinds of News activities are presented live in the studio room. The live News/program is being controlled from the Master control room (MCR) By a certain specialist and trained personnel whom is saddled with the responsibility of Controlling all the studio activities on system and calling action of when the live program ought to start and end.

One of the live programs I usually witness is Cliq chat whereby different programs come up such as interviews on a certain issue by guest speaker and host, Call in by listeners, News review and others interest topics. News is another live program broadcasted to the audience Morning, afternoon and night, I have the experience of watching the News presenter reading the content of news to the viewers while a technical personnel controlling the pictures, images, videos or sounds from the master control room. The personnel is known as master control room operators.

I also have the experience of witnessing major equipment in the news room and how it is used such as Teleprompter, Microphones, Headphones, Cameras, Tripod etc. I usually watch how camera are usedw by the technical personnel during live program and with the experience it will be more easier for me to handle camera anytime I really want to for practical work of communication.

#### 4.2 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The students industrial work experience scheme (SIWES) is a training fund (ITF) in 1973 to bridge the gap between theory and practical oriented among students of engineering, technology, social science and medical science on Nigeria higher institution of learning.

It provides for the job practical experience for students as they are expose to work method and machinery that may not be Available in their institution. At inception in 1974, the scheme started with 748 from 11 institution and 104 eligible course by 2008. 210 student participate in the course from 219 institution over the 112 eligible course. However the rapid growth and exposition of SIWES has occurred against the backdrop of successive economic crisis which have affected the smooth operation and administration of the scheme. Most industries are operating below in storage capacity while other are completely shutdown in Nigeria. This has impacted negatively on the scheme as higher institution of learning find it increasingly difficult to secure placement

The major challenge I faced during the four months program is that of transportation both scarcity of vehicles and financially. I always have a tough morning before getting a cab and later that of charges.
